Spell words ending with the 'g' sound spelt 'gue' and the k sound spelt — que

Spell homophones accept/except, affect/effect, ball/bawl, berry/bury, knot/not, medal/meddle, missed/mist, reign/rain, whose/who's

Spell more complex words that are often misspelt for year 3 & 4 Spell words with the 's' sounds spelt 'sc'

Place the **possessive apostrophe** accurately in words with regular plurals.
